### ZSO is not <u>a Trust; it is a Commonwealth:</u>

- Trusts are creatures of a long-past era, when the rich were few and the poor were many. Trusts were a mechanism for distributing the settlor's (donor's) wealth, in a <u>one-to-many relationship</u>. ZSO is a creature of modern Canadian Zoroastrian society where almost everybody is comfortable, where everybody is working to improve the lives of each other, in a <u>many-to-many relationship</u>.
- Most organizations have a general body of members who elect their leaders e.g. ZSOs Executive Committee. In sharp contrast, a Trust does not have a general body of members; the only members are the Trustees themselves.
- ZSO Executives have a term of two years. Trustees may also have a fixed term, but in reality Trustees tend to keep electing themselves over and over again, effectively resulting in lifetime tenure.
- Trustees justify their long tenure by claiming that it allows them to take a long-term view; in reality it is just a cover for hoarding funds which is why governments in most countries have enacted laws to force Trusts to spend a majority of their income every year. ZSOs Executive Committee has no desire to hoard funds but rather to apply them for appropriate purposes to improve the lives of members.
- Safe lifetime tenure of Trustees makes them impervious to changing socio-economic needs. ZSOs Executive Committee (EC) is elected by the members and can be voted out if it does not perform over its two-year term.
- Being a closed shop, Trustees avoid raising funds, because new donors often demand a say in the Trust's affairs, which dilutes the power of the existing Trustees. ZSOs Executive Committee actively seeks to raise funds for community welfare and welcomes new donors to bring in fresh ideas and new money.
- Being unable to raise funds, Trusts seek refuge in "Heritage Status" for their buildings and work to lock-in the community to their buildings, even if the building is obsolete and unsuitable for the community's needs. ZSOs Executive Committee realizes that **Heritage Status destroys asset-value** and actively seeks to avoid it. The Zoroastrian world is littered with obsolete buildings belonging to defunct Trusts.
- An appropriate majority can amend the ZSOs Constitution. A Trust cannot be amended and requires court approval, which is extremely difficult to get. This makes Trusts totally unsuitable for the rapidly evolving society that we live in.
- Trusts promote dependency upon Trust-money; ZSO promotes self-reliance by working to improve the lives of each other.
- Trusts claim to have deep pockets; ZSO has many pockets and can draw upon ~5,000 Zoroastrians in Ontario.
- Trusts are ideal for distributing their wealth to other causes. **ZSO does NOT distribute its wealth to outside causes**; its primary objective is to optimize the long-term welfare of its own members.

**ZSO is not a Trust. It is a Commonwealth**. Its leaders are **Managers, Not Trustees.** ZSO is happy to work with Trusts that understand and accept the nature of ZSO. ZSO welcomes **direct members of the Guiv family** to serve on the board of the Trust that has partnered with ZSO.

In a recent issue of *Parsiana* magazine, Darius Khambata (Advocate-general of Maharashtra state) depicts how the Zoroastrian community's social policy and religious practices came under the sway of Trusts, resulting in the subversion of fundamental Zoroastrian concepts. The RGFO Trust-deed also specifies a two-year term for the Trustees, but this rule appears to have been ignored for the last 30 years. Even the President of USA – the world's most powerful person – has just two terms.

#### EC News:

- <u>Direct Contact with the Guiv Family:</u> On 14<sup>th</sup> October 2013, at precisely 2:50 pm, Kaikhosrow Guiv returned a phone-call from President Sarosh Bharucha. Bharucha briefly described the renovations to the MGDM and invited the entire Guiv family to Donors Day to be held in 2014 to mark the opening of the renovated MGDM. He expressed regret that ZSO has not had any direct contact with the Guiv family for nearly 25 years. Kaikhosrow had many happy memories of ZSO and was very appreciative of ZSOs activities. Without any hint from Bharucha, Kaikhosrow himself volunteered that <u>the Guiv family "does not want to see its name on the building" not just once, but twice.</u> ZSO has absolutely no desire to change the name of the building; nor does ZSO seek any change in the ownership of the building. ZSO is in full compliance of the Trust-deed and the Lease.
- IT Infrastructure: When you phone TD Bank, it knows of all the relationships that you have with the bank (e.g. Chequing Account, Car Loan, Retirement Account, Insurance, etc.) giving it a comprehensive view of the customer and allowing it to target its services in a customized way. Even Pizza Pizza has complete information about its customers. ZSO is working to categorize all its members in terms of the relationships that each member has with ZSO (e.g. Senior, Scouts, Children's Religion Class, Kanoun, Entertainment, Member-type, etc.) to gain a comprehensive view of its members and participants at various events. ZSO is not just a mutual fund of subcommittees; the WHOLE is greater than the sum of its parts. In order to build community-unity and deepen ZSOs reach, ZSO needs an integrated view of each and every participant in its programs whether they are members or not.
- Monies Collected by Sub-Committees: All monies collected by sub-committees from any source whatsoever (fees, gate money, proceeds from functions, etc.) must be turned over to the Treasurer promptly. The Treasurer has discretion to permit a sub-committee to hold funds up to a certain limit to cover petty-cash expenses. All sub-committees are requested to promptly inform the Treasurer of all monies that they are holding. ZSOs constitution states clearly that only the President/EVP and Treasurer/Assistant Treasurer have signing authority over payments. Sub-committees are not permitted to transfer/donate any money outside ZSO. Donors are concerned that ZSO is seeking donations with one hand, while flushing out its own money to others with the other hand.
- <u>Finance:</u> Asst. Treasurer Atoosa Javandmarian has commenced the production of monthly income and expense statements. The plan is to complete all financial statements within 2 weeks of year-end. Treasurer Jamshed Kershaw is conducting studies pertaining to procurement, cost-efficiencies and financial controls. Past inadequacies in financial controls are being addressed as they could jeopardize ZSOs tax-exempt status.
- <u>MGDM Renovations:</u> Plan submission is targeted for 15<sup>th</sup> December. Some concerns were expressed about structural matters, which have been resolved by the architect. In response to multiple recommendations, ZSO has appointed the architect to manage the full implementation of the project to completion. Despite the fact that the Building Rebuild Project was terminated in April 2012 (19 months ago), the permit applications were never withdrawn by the Building Project Committee or the previous Executive Committee. Also, the letters-of-credit posted with the City have not been recovered which is costing ZSO. There is no documentation about the permit or letters of-credit in ZSOs files anywhere. Accordingly, a new permit application cannot be made.
- <u>Newsletter:</u> Besides Canada, USA, UK, Hong Kong, Pakistan and India, ZSOs newsletter now reaches the far corners of the earth via email from France, Dubai, Russia, Italy, Belgium, Australia, Switzerland, Finland and even Romania. With the retirement of Mehru and Eruch Mahva, the tasks of folding, packing, sealing and stamping the newsletters will pass to our custodian Gulcher Irani. Welcome aboard, Gulcher!
- <u>Scholarships</u>: ZSO is in conversation with sponsors to finance the remaining four un-financed awards. Conversations are also underway with an organization for sponsoring an entirely different class of awards.
- *Directory:* The Directory is ready to go to the printers in early December for distribution in January.

**<u>Progress as Promised:</u>** The following has been accomplished in the first 120-days of the new EC:

- November 2013: Enterprise day held, after a lapse of 8 years.
- *October 2013:* Renovations to Caretaker's apartment completed. Sponsorships for two scholarship awards received. Computerized vital records uploaded to the Cloud. First-ever Strategy Day held.
- September 2013: Newsletter is made available to anyone via email.
- August 2013: Opened up attendance to Executive Committee meetings.

<u>Scouting News</u>: Aban Karkaria was a keen Girl Guide during her school days in Mumbai and Panchgani. She immigrated to Canada in 1970 and for 11 years from 1978 to 1989 she volunteered as a Girl Guide Leader at the Lynden District School, Toronto (near Victoria Park and Danforth). She left that position in Dec 1989 when the school shifted to downtown Toronto, a considerable distance from her residence. Our 100 Toronto Scout Group started in 1990, and it became a co-ed Group two years later. To meet Scouts Canada requirements, 100 Toronto had to enroll female leaders. Aban readily joined our Group in September 1992 in the Cub Section where she has been serving as Leader to date. She has also served as Secretary of 100 Toronto for the past 5 years - a most meticulous and painstaking duty.

Aban has recently done an amazing thing just this past October when, although a senior, she undertook two weekends at an intensive Training Camp for Cub Leaders which has earned her the coveted *Wood Badge II - the ultimate Badge for Scout Leaders*. What a glorious achievement as a Senior Citizen!

But her accomplishments and services do not stop there. Since 1999 she has been volunteering at Women's College Hospital, Toronto. For this Volunteer service of several hundred hours each year, under *Bell Canada's "Employee Giving Program"*, she receives \$500 to donate to a charity, and over these past 14 years Aban has been donating to Women's College and to our 100 Toronto Scout Group. Above all, Aban has a very cheerful disposition, and she manages to smile even when chastising our 100 Toronto Group Committee members for lapses and omissions!! <u>Down Memory Lane – The ZSO Bus</u>: Back in the 70s, it was rare to see a home with a two-car garage, because most families had only one car. In order to overcome this problem, some of our youngsters pooled their pocket money and purchased a bus, which used to be parked at the foot of the MGDM driveway to Bayview Avenue. Parents would drop off the youngsters at the MGDM and then they would take off on a picnic or a jaunt somewhere in the ZSO-Mobile. Phil Sidhwa was one of the youth-leaders responsible for that initiative. The bus was also used to pick up "passengers" from Finch subway station – clearly demonstrating that distance and lack–of-transport was never really a problem. "Necessity became the mother of invention"

By the early 80s, with female spouses entering the workforce, incomes jumped and two-income families living in homes with two-car garages became the norm. By the mid 90s, the Mobility bus for seniors became available to transport seniors anywhere within Metropolitan Toronto for a mere \$2. By early 2000 most Zoroastrian families had reached an affluence level to afford a car for each and every adult in the family. The overwhelming majority (99%) arrives at the MGDM by car. Many churches offer a bus-service to transport their members. The Armenian community owns an entire fleet of buses. ZSO invites public input for a bus-service.

<u>Music to Soothe the Soul</u>: It is pretty much impossible to get Canadian kids out of bed, unless of course it is for hockey practice or band practice. A music program is under consideration to bring the community together through the simple pleasures of music. The format of the program is open, but will probably converge around western music practice at the MGDM on a weekday evening, perhaps every two weeks under the leadership of an instructor. The program is clearly targeted to those who already play an instrument, but novices are also encouraged to apply. ## **Granny Engineer Bags a Silver Jubilee Award**



On 19<sup>th</sup> October 2013, Havovi Engineer celebrated her 75<sup>th</sup> Birthday with friends and family. She was pleasantly surprised by MP Jim Karygiannis who awarded the Scarborough-Agincourt Silver Jubilee Award to Havovi for having served the Scarborough-Agincourt community for over 40 years as a volunteer. She has always fought for equity in the Scarborough Board of Education and was one of the first female teachers to receive a Master of Education degree. Havovi joined Mayor Faubert's Race Relations Committee to work on improving equity in Scarborough. She also worked on the Thompson Park Museum Board, & had her ESL choir perform at St. Paul Senior Home, Scarborough Grace Hospital and the Scarborough Civic Centre. Some may argue that her greatest contribution was investing in disadvantaged youth. Havovi tirelessly worked as a school teacher for the Scarborough Board of Education where she shared her whole life with her students; taking them on trips to her cottage, hosting parties for them at her house, and doing whatever was necessary to encourage them, providing them with a safe, rich, and nurturing environment.

Havovi was the first to introduce the idea of a ZSO scholarship program at the Information meeting in late 2011. She has been a vigorous participant in recent ZSO debates and contributed actively through her ideas. A fearless opponent of the proxy-system, she spoke extensively about the abuses of such a system.

Mother of three and grandmother of five, Havovi enjoys spending time with Nikko, her 11-year-old American - Eskimo, traveling, going to her cottage and serving the community.


