Celebrating Nowruz

The celebration of Nowruz dates back to at least the 11th century A.D. In the Shahnameh – or "Book of Kings" – a text that dates to the first century, the <u>story of King Jamshid</u> is told as part of the Nowruz origin story. King Jamshid, the fourth king in an imagined dynasty, is introduced as the kindest and most knowledgeable ruler of Persia, the region that stretched from what is modern Turkey to Pakistan. Jamshid is <u>referred to</u> in Zoroastrian texts from the first century as well.

The Shahnameh tells the story of a king who was very sensitive not only to his subjects but also to the rhythms of the Earth. King Jamshid noticed that during the long, dark winter months, his subjects descended into darkness as the Earth worked to heal itself from the harvests of the fall.

When spring finally came and the Earth began to blossom after the healing period of winter, the king wanted to mark that as the start of the new year – a time of new beginnings for people and the Earth.

But King Jamshid also noticed that during those dark winter months, many of his subjects had started to quarrel with one another, and injustice threatened to take over. The king decided to mark the beginning of Nowruz with a festival called Shab-e-Charshanbeh Souri, which translates as "Scarlet Wednesday."

The festival involves jumping over a series of fires – a tradition brought by the Zoroastrians, who worshiped fire as the sign of everlasting strength and health. The idea behind Charshanbeh-Souri is to jump over the fires to cleanse oneself of the ills – physical, emotional and societal – of the past year. It is a way to prepare for the <u>rebirth</u> that Nowruz brings. When individuals and families jump over the fire, they ask the fire to take their sickness and all the unhappiness of the past year. They also ask the fire to give them strength and health.

The tradition also urges individuals to make amends with those they believe have wronged them in the past. They also seek forgiveness for their own wrongs. This is symbolized by celebrators joining their hands as they jump over the fire together.



The day after Charshanbeh-Souri, families begin preparing their homes for Nowruz. They set a table called the haft-seen – translating to "seven S's." At the center of the table are seven items that begin with the letter S, each holding a particular significance. Seeb (apple) is the symbol of beauty, seer (garlic) is the symbol of health and medicine, somagh (sumac) represents sunrise, sabzeh (green grass) represents healing and rebirth of the Earth, serkeh (vinegar) symbolizes patience, senjed (olives) signals love and, finally, samanu (pastry paste) is about the power and strength of forgiveness.

At the center of the table, a mirror is placed for reflection, flowers to symbolize the Earth's healing, eggs to symbolize life and a live fish to represent one's connection to the animal world. Some families place a religious book at the table, such as the Quran, Bible or Avista; others place books by favorite Iranian poets such as Hafez or Rumi.

As we move forward and learn to live in this new pandemic age – I strongly believe that these customs and rituals continue to give us the sense of community that is needed more than ever.

No matter how you celeberate spring or Norooz – the ZSO Board of Directors wish you and your family and friends a peaceful and prosperous New Year.

Obituary - Scouter Maneck Sattha



This monthly report of the First Zoroastrian Scout Group is dedicated in memory of one of its Founding Members, Scouter Maneck Framroze Sattha, who passed away peacefully in his sleep on Sunday, Feb 20th, 2022.

Over the past six years, our Group has unfortunately lost four of its Founding Members; Jimmy Mistry (2016), Noshir Mirza (2017), Phiroz Dastoor (2020) and now Maneck Sattha. The Group is still blessed with the remaining three surviving Founding Members, Vispi Patel, Noshir Dastoor and Freddy Mirza, as resource scouters, guides and mentors.

Scouter Maneck was a scout and later on became a Scout Leader in the 11th Central Bombay District Association (11CBDA,) in Dadar Parsi Colony, Mumbai, India for nearly 20 years before immigrating to Canada in 1972.

After settling in Toronto, he continued as a Scouter in the 130th
Thorncliffe Park Scout Group from 1979 to 1981 and later on with the
30th Richmond Hill Scout Group from 1982 to 1984. Maneck was our
Group's Troop Leader from the time it was established in 1990 until
1998. In 1996, he was instrumental in communicating with the NASA's
Johnson Space Centre in Houston and succeeded in sending our Scout

Group photo on board the space shuttle mission No STS-76 "Atlantis" from March 22 to 31, 1996. In his report to the Group Committee, he wrote that the launch and the touchdown of the space shuttle brought tears of joy and it was a very meaningful and crowning experience for him to put 'our group in Space'. Maneck continued as a member of the Group Committee as an archivist as well as maintaining a record of the Group's equipment and took pride in documenting the group's activities in photo albums which he decorated with his artistic skills

Maneck enjoyed attending our Canadian Jamborees that took place every 4 years - since 1984 right up to 1997 and also attended the World Jamborees as one of the "Jambassadors" in Canada, Holland, Japan, Sweden and Thailand. He had attended the Scouting Movement's Centenary in 2007 in Switzerland.

He had a passion for gardening as well as collecting Scouting paraphernalia such as woggles (scout scarf slide), scarves, crests, mugs and other mementos from the Jamborees. Maneck took great pride in displaying the same to the youths. He taught many scouting skills, such as, woggle making, axeman ship, pioneering etc. to young scouts in Canada as well as overseas and gave very interesting sessions on the same. He used to say that "scouting is in my blood and veins".

In scouting, when a person passes away, we say that Scouter has 'gone home'. The scouting sign to indicate a person has gone home after a journey is to place a small stone on top of a larger stone which was one of the pioneering signs that Lord Baden Powell picked up from the natives in Africa. Scouter Maneck has now "Gone Home". May Scouter Maneck's soul rest in the Abode of Ahura Mazda's Garo Demana.


پشتیبان مالی انجمن را به یاد داشته باشید
